Charter Petitions Update

Thank you to those teachers who spoke out at the special board hearing on August 11th. Your voices were critical. We want to encourage our School Board to support our neighborhood schools and deny these charter petitions on September 23rd.

We are asking that all teachers attend the MHUSD Board Meeting on **September 23**, as the board will be voting on the charter petitions at that meeting. We don't want the only faces they see to be those of the charter promoters!

Last year during Charter appeals hearings at the Santa Clara County Board of Education, board members who ultimately rejected those appeals requested updates on ways that MHUSD is finding innovative ways to serve the community. Please continue to have parents and staff email board members, invite county board members to your site, or email updates to them. We are looking for as many teachers and community members to attend county meetings with an update from their site during public comment sections as possible.

We want to give updates to the County Board Members and let them know about the fantastic things happening in our classes. Anything you have to share should

Political Update Campaign 2014 - Defending Public Education

On Monday, August 18, the South Bay Labor Council (SBLC) formally endorsed MHUSD Trustee Claudia Rossi for the Santa Clara County Board of Education - Area 7 seat. Claudia will be running against the incumbent, Julia Hover-Smoot. Area 7 covers a large area from Gilroy to most of East Side Union High School District. Last spring, Hover-Smoot used her position on the county board to issue a scathing criticism of our district's schools, and called upon her fellow trustees to vote to approve the Navigator and Rocketship charter petitions.

"It is absolutely no secret here today that we have a group of people in Morgan Hill who are not being served," Hover-Smoot said. "It's wrong. It's deadly wrong for us to allow this to continue even one more day." San Jose Mercury News

In 2011, when the county board voted to authorize Rocketship to open 20 new schools throughout the county, Hover-Smoot wrote an editorial in which she said that she believed the 20 new Rocketship charters were not enough, and that in fact all 97 county elementary schools that were identified as underperforming should be replaced with similar charter schools.

In this election, the South Bay Labor Council wants to make a statement about public education. Their leadership wants to help change the trajectory of the Santa Clara County Board of Education, and electing Claudia Rossi as a county trustee is a major part of that plan. In order to do that it is up to us to make sure that voters throughout District 7 know what Claudia stands for. We are asking our members to walk for Claudia in those sections of San Jose covered by Area 7. We will meet at the South Bay Labor Council on September 13th at 9:00 am. After our district, union, board, and community denied Navigator and Rocketship, it was the South Bay Labor Council's influence that helped us win at the county board. They bring the pressure of not just our union, but also other unions working in public education (SEIU and CSEA) and the construction unions that build and maintain our schools. We will support these unions by also walking for San Jose mayoral candidate, Dave Cortese. He is a former Franklin-McKinley board member and is committed to protecting education from privatization.

The 2014 election is important to education in all of Santa Clara County. We need to show our commitment to our profession, our schools, and our students by working hard to elect board members at the county and local level who believe in the value of a true public education.

MHFT has interviewed eight of the nine candidates running for the Morgan Hill School Board. SBLC has interviewed six. Soon SBLC will endorse four candidates for the four open seats. We will announce those endorsements on September 15th.

She will be on part-time release until November 4th to work on our local elections through a grant from CFT. We are excited to welcome Anna Olagues of San Martin-Gwinn and Itzel Coronel-Velasco of Sobrato as site leaders! We are building unity with our communities.

Online Payroll

Our district is in the process of converting to Paperless Direct Deposit Pay Stubs effective with the August 2014 payroll. This means if you currently receive your paycheck through direct deposit, you will **not** receive an August pay stub. You may, however, access **all** of your personal payroll information online at the Employee Self Service (ESS) website at https://ess.sccoe.org/. You should have received a personalized confidential letter that contained your MHUSD employee ID number and a handout with step-by-step directions for registration on the website. Please review your letter and the attached directions as soon as possible so that you may be registered online in time to view your August payroll information. You will only need your teacher-specific ID number the first time to set up your account. If you have lost your specific ID number, call Danielle Nunez in payroll at x51063.

Please continue to report all facility issues to your principal until they are fixed. Our facilities work is transitioning to an in-house management style, so please work through your site principal rather than calling the District Office.
